# WHAT IS NSO?

In order to plan your courses, you will need to review your program of interest in the Academic Calendar. The Academic Calendar can be found online at [www.nipissingu.ca/calendar](http://www.nipissingu.ca/calendar). Once you have reviewed what courses are required for your program, you can look on WebAdvisor to see what courses are available this year.

Schedule an appointment with an Academic Advisor to finalize your course selection. Appointments can be conducted in person or over the phone.

# HOW TO FIND YOUR TRANSFER CREDITS

1. Go to Nipissing University's Website: [www.nipissingu.ca](http://www.nipissingu.ca) and then click the 'MyNipissing' link in the top right corner.
2. In the Sign-In section, enter your WebAdvisor username (first letter of your surname in lower case, followed by your student ID number).
3. If you have never logged into WebAdvisor, your password will be your date of birth in the following format: Mmmddyyyy (case sensitive). For example, if your birthday is September 9, 1995 then your password would be Sep091995.
4. If you have already logged into WebAdvisor and you created a new password, you will then use your new password. If you did not change your password you can continue to use your birthdate.
5. Click Sign In.
6. Click on Go to WebAdvisor.
7. Select "Students" and Select "Summary of Transfer Credits" under Academic Profile
8. If this summary section is blank, and you feel you should be receiving transfer credits click Return to Menu and click on "Important Documents Outstanding/Received" under Communication to check on the status of any required documents. Any questions should be directed to the Registrar's Office at registrar@nipissingu.ca or 705-474-3450, ext. 4600.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR COURSE REGISTRATION

1. Go to Nipissing University's Website: [www.nipissingu.ca](http://www.nipissingu.ca) and then click the 'My Nipissing' link in the top right corner.
2. Enter your user name (first letter of your surname followed by your student ID number) and enter your password in the following format: Mmmddyyyy. (For example, if your birthday is September 9, 1995 then your password would be Sep091995. Please note that the month is three letters starting with a capital letter). Click submit.
3. Click on Go to "WebAdvisor".
4. Click on "Students".
5. Click on "Search and Register for Classes".
6. Select the term 18FW – UG 2018/19FA/WI from the dropdown menu.
7. Select a subject (e.g., Biology) from the dropdown menu and hit 'Submit'. You may also choose to filter your search by inputting the course number and/or location. The following screen will display the results of your search. Click the box on the left to choose the courses in which you wish to register. Click "Submit".

9. On the following screen (Preferred Sections), select an action for each course you have selected. In the action box, you have three options: 'Register', 'Remove from list', or 'Waitlist'.

If the course is open, select 'Register' to enroll in the course.

If the course is full and you wish to go on a waiting list, select 'Waitlist' to be added to the waiting list.

If you neither want to register nor want to go on the waiting list, you can choose 'Remove from List' to remove that course selection from your Preferred Sections.

Once you choose what you want to do, click 'Submit'. Please note that the system will only allow you to register for courses you are eligible to take.

10. On the following screen, you will receive a message indicating your status in the chosen course(s). Your status should appear as 'Registered for this section' to indicate that you have registered successfully in the course.
11. Return to the menu, click on 'Search and Register for Classes' and repeat the steps to register in courses of a different discipline.
12. To drop courses on WebAdvisor, click on 'Register/Drop Classes'. The screen will list both your Preferred Sections and Current Registrations. Under Current Registrations, select the course you wish to drop and click "Submit". You will receive a message indicating your status in the chosen course(s). Your status should appear as 'Dropped for this section' to indicate that you have successfully dropped the course.
13. To get a listing of your courses, click on 'View My Class Selections' or 'View My Timetable'. It is a good idea to double-check your registration through these screens after making any changes to ensure everything is as you expect.

# INSTRUCTIONS FOR MANAGING MY WAITLIST

For courses that allow a waiting list, Manage My Waitlist will show you what position you are on the waiting list. You will also be able to register yourself in the course once a space is available.

1. At any time you may select Manage My Waitlist to see what position you are on a list.
2. If space is available in a course Manage My Waitlist will show the status as "Permission to Register". An email will also be sent to your Nipissing student email account to notify you that a space is available.
3. To register in the course you would select the action 'Register'.

If you do not wish to remain on a waiting list, go to Manage My Waitlist and select the action 'Remove' to remove your name from the waiting list.

# FAQ - ACADEMIC PLANNING

## When can I register for courses?

Registration for students with transfer credits or advanced standing will open on June 18th. Registration for all other newly-admitted students will open on June 25th.

## What is the registration deposit?

Before registering, you must pay a \$200 non-refundable registration deposit. The registration deposit is required for all students including those with bursaries, OSAP, scholarships, or alternative funding. This deposit cannot be deferred.

## What is the difference between the course codes FA, WI and FW?

The codes FA, WI and FW indicate the term in which a course is offered.

FA = fall (September to December) and courses are typically worth 3 credits.

WI = winter (January to April) and courses are typically worth 3 credits.

FW = fall and winter (September to April) and courses are typically worth 6 credits.

## How many courses should I be registered in each semester?

Students taking a 30-credit load should register in no more than five courses in the fall term and five courses in the winter term. Students in a 24- credit load may have no more than four courses in both the fall and winter terms.

## I am on a waiting list. What do I do?

All courses allow you to place yourself on a waiting list if they are full. If you are on a waiting list and an opening becomes available, an email will be sent to your Nipissing University student email address notifying you that a space is available. You will then have

72 hours to register for the course on WebAdvisor. If you do not register within the time allowed, you will be removed from the waiting list, so be sure to check your student email daily.

## What is the French Placement Assessment?

Prior to enrolling in any French course, students are required to write the Nipissing University French placement test. This test will evaluate the language competency of students and enable them to enroll in the appropriate language level.

The French Placement Assessment will be offered the evenings of July 8 – 12, 2018 and again during the first week of classes in September.

## When will my transfer credit assessment be completed?

Upon receipt of your final transcript from either your college or previous university, it may take 2 to 4 weeks to assess your transfer credits as each student is assessed independently and in their own circumstances (ie. Previous grades, intended major, etc.). Please ensure that the Office of the Registrar has the proper final transcript and all other relevant information. You can check to see if all documents have been received by logging onto MyNipissing and checking WebAdvisor by clicking on 'Important Documents Outstanding/Received' under Communication. ## ACADEMIC ADVISING

Academic Advisors are available for all matters related to degree requirements. Offering information and assistance with course selections, degree audits and more, your Academic Advisor will assist you with reaching your academic goals.

## ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

We feel that all students have a right to accessible, barrier-free learning environments. Students with temporary and permanent disabilities are encouraged to become acquainted with the staff in our Accessibility Services office to discuss programs and support services that will make your academic journey a rewarding experience.

## ATHLETIC SERVICES

Go Lakers! Whether you are a fitness or outdoor enthusiast, a varsity or intramural team member, or a number one fan, the Student Athletics Centre has what you need. The facility features 3 gyms, 2 international squash courts, cardio studio, weight room, and fitness classes like spin, Zumba, kickboxing and dance. The cost for the use of these services is included in your student fees. If that's not enough, there are 20 km of hiking trails and a waterfall right on campus.

## CAMPUS SHOP

Located on-campus on the main floor, visit the Campus shop for all your textbooks, school supplies, and Nipissing University merchandise.

## COUNSELLING SERVICES

Counselling supports are available for all Nipissing University students. Our Counsellors are qualified professionals who are familiar with a broad range of personal wellness issues that affect academic success and personal growth. All services are free and confidential.

## FINANCIAL SERVICES

You will quickly become familiar with the friendly and efficient people in this department who handle all matters regarding tuition, incidental, and miscellaneous fees. They are also experts where government assistance (OSAP, etc.), scholarships, bursaries and awards are concerned.

## HARRIS LEARNING LIBRARY

The library's large, bright space offers a comfortable space to do research, study or meet up with friends. From September to April, the library is open 7 days a week. You can access:

- Windows and Mac desktop computers;
- Wireless access;
- Printing, photocopying, and scanning;
- Laptop loans (in-library use only);
- Bookable group workrooms;
- Comfortable lounge, booths and tables;
- Silent study rooms;
- Resources of all kinds (books, ebooks, magazines, newspapers and journals, DVDs, government documents, maps; kits, puppets).

## HEALTH SERVICES

The Campus Health Centre has a dedicated team of professionals who are ready to help you with the following services:

- Illness
- First Aid
- Injury and Sports Injuries
- Sutures
- Injections (incl. Allergy, Depo Provera, B12)
- [Immunization](#) (incl. TB testing, tetanus, MMR, Hepatitis B, varicella, Gardasil and others by request)

- On-Site Laboratory (Bloodwork)
- [Sexual Health](#) (Birth control, Pap smears, STI testing)

Located in room B205, the office is open from Monday to Friday. A student health insurance plan is also available to all students, part-time or full-time, through the Nipissing University Student Union (NUSU). Benefits include:

- Prescription drugs;
- Coverage for health services such as physiotherapy and massage therapy (with physician referral);
- Dental accident expense reimbursement, and
- Benefits for accidental death and dismemberment (plan details may change and will be made available prior to enrolling).

Students have the option to add on family and dependents. Student cards act as claim cards at pharmacies in most locations or manual claims can be made by submitting claim forms (available in the NUSU Office).

## INTERNATIONAL INITIATIVES

International Initiatives provides opportunities for Nipissing University students to internationalize their degree through a variety of intercultural experiences. Offering study exchanges to 20 different countries, language programs, internship/volunteer programs, and on-campus engagement opportunities, there is a program to suit the needs of every NU student.

## MEAL PLANS

While a meal plan is not mandatory, it will certainly add convenience to a busy student life. Let our on campus food service providers take care of food preparation, cooking and cleaning. Two different meal plans are available on campus through Chartwells and gd2go.

## NIPISSING UNIVERSITY STUDENT UNION (NUSU)

NUSU represents the Nipissing University student body at both the North Bay and Muskoka campuses, and is part of the Canadian Federation of Students. NUSU's primary purpose is to democratically represent its students and advocate for positive change on student issues. Additionally, NUSU provides a range of services from health and dental to the student food bank, and funding clubs to providing job opportunities. NUSU also serves specific student interests through its recognition and/or funding of clubs and societies as well as running awareness campaigns. # FAQ - TRANSITION PLANNING

## What is my student email?

Your Nipissing University student email is the only email account the university can use to communicate with you. Your student email can be accessed by clicking on 'My Nipissing' in the top right hand corner at [www.nipissingu.ca](http://www.nipissingu.ca). Once you have logged in click on Check Your Email.

## Where can I get my booklist?

Booklists are available online through the Campus Store website. [www.bkstr.com](http://www.bkstr.com)

## How do I get my Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) funding?

OSAP is issued in two installments of approximately 60% of your total funding being provided in the fall, and 40% in the winter.

Starting late August/early September, the Financial Aid Office will send an electronic confirmation of your course registration, which will allow the OSAP funding to be direct-deposited to your bank account (as long as your OSAP file is complete). Tuition and/or residence installments will be paid automatically from your OSAP (as long as you agreed to this process on the application form, and as long as there is sufficient OSAP funding to cover it). On [www.osap.gov.on.ca](http://www.osap.gov.on.ca) click on 'check status >>funding summary' to confirm your OSAP amounts. Also check the Finance website for information on what is due and when.

## Is there any social programming for Mature and Transfer Students?

Yes! The Mature and Transfer Student Network offers students social and transitional support through events, workshops.



## I have a disability and/or Individualized Education Plan. Who do I contact to arrange or continue my academic support?

If you have a disability, and/or an individualized Education Plan (IEP) in high school you may be eligible for support for academic accommodations and disability-related supports during your studies at Nipissing University.



