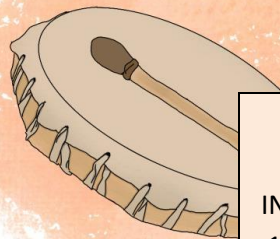

Vanessa is Inuk and Ojibwe. Her maternal family is from Sanikiluaq, Nunavut however her mother was born and raised in Moose Factory, ON. Vanessa's paternal family is from Mattagami First Nation, ON. Vanessa has created her own business Resilient Inuk Creations and chooses to create red dress items out of sealskin in honour of her missing sister. She also shares her truths through many different presentations. Her goal is to create more awareness across Turtle Island. Vanessa shares her sister Pamela's story on her verified Tik Tok account "Resilient Inuk" where she has over 118,000 followers and over 2.6 million likes.
