FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What do I do now?

Carefully read the enclosed information so you understand your Offer of Admission and any conditions attached to it. Then you may accept the offer.

How do I accept my Offer of Admission?

Accept your Offer of Admission on the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) website and follow the instructions printed on your offer. To guarantee your spot in any limited enrolment program you need to accept your offer by the expiry date.

What does it mean if I have a conditional Offer of Admission?


If you currently have courses in progress, or have not graduated, your offer will be conditional upon successful completion of your courses and diploma by June 30, 2025. An admission chart outlining required averages and prerequisite courses is outlined on the back of this page. This is your Offer of Admission and you should accept by the deadline even though you have not yet met the conditions.

What does it mean if I receive an offer to an Alternate Program?

If you do not meet the admission requirements for the program you have applied for we will offer you admission to a program for which you are eligible. Some of the possible reasons may be that you applied to a program that;

- requires a specific course, such as 4U math or equivalent, and you do not have that course completed or in progress, or
- we have established you have not, or will not meet the minimum entrance average.

What happens if I don't meet the conditions of my offer of admission?

If you do not have the prerequisite courses or the final admission average by June 30, 2025 for the program you have been offered, we may change your offer of admission to an alternate program for which you are eligible. If your final admission average on your best six 4U/4M courses or equivalent, including prerequisites, is below 70% but above 60% we will change your offer to full-time admission with a reduced course load. If you plan to continue your studies into the summer please complete the "Intent to Complete Additional Secondary School Courses" form. This form can be found on our website at www.nipissingu.ca/RegistrarForms. We will only cancel an offer if the conditions are not met once all courses are completed.

How can I check the status of my application?

"My Nipissing" is a valuable online information system and we encourage you to regularly check WebAdvisor. Information on how to access "My Nipissing" was included in the email you received acknowledging your application. It will indicate when we have received your acceptance from the Ontario Universities' Application Centre. We also recommend you regularly check your email.

When do I register for my courses?

In June, we will email you detailed information regarding registration.

What about Residence?

Residence information and application instructions are included in this package. If you meet the residence application and deposit deadlines you will be guaranteed a room in residence. The residence application is available online. Please see the enclosed residence brochure for more information.

What about scholarships, bursaries, awards and other financial assistance?

You can find additional information about scholarships included with this package. Entrance Scholarships are guaranteed with no application required. You are also encouraged to apply for a selection of other scholarships, bursaries and awards that are available. If you are an Ontario resident and need help paying for your education, the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) may be able to help. Go to ontario.ca/osap to see how much you could get and to apply.
