

## Congratulations on your Offer of Admission!

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

### What do I do now?

Carefully read the enclosed information so you understand your Offer of Admission and any conditions attached to it. Then you may accept the offer.

### How do I accept my Offer of Admission?

Accept your Offer of Admission on the Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) website and follow the instructions printed on your offer. To guarantee your spot in any limited enrolment program you need to accept your offer by the expiry date.

### What does it mean if I have a conditional Offer of Admission?

If you currently have courses in progress, or have not graduated (if applicable), your offer will be conditional upon successfully completing your courses and/or diploma/degree. You must forward a final official transcript to us showing all courses are completed and your diploma has been awarded (if applicable). An admission chart on the back of this page outlines the prerequisite courses. This is your Offer of Admission and you should accept by the deadline even if you have not yet met the conditions.

# What does it mean if I receive an offer to an Alternate Program?

If you do not meet the admission requirements for the program you have applied for, we will offer you admission to a program for which you are eligible. Some of the possible reasons may be that you applied to a program that;

- requires a specific course, such as 4U math or equivalent, and you do not have that course completed or in progress, or
- we have established you have not, or will not meet the minimum entrance average.



## What happens if I don't meet the conditions of my offer of admission?

If you do not have the prerequisite courses or the final admission average by June 30, 2025 for the program you have been offered, we may change your offer of admission to an alternate program for which you are eligible or place you on probation or a reduced course load. We will only rescind an offer if you are not eligible for admission once all courses are completed.

### How can I check the status of my application?

"My Nipissing" is a valuable online information system and we encourage you to regularly check WebAdvisor. Information on how to access "My Nipissing" was included in the package you received acknowledging your application. It will indicate when we receive your acceptance from the Ontario Universities' Application Centre. We also recommend you regularly check your email.

### When will I receive my transfer credits?

We will process your transfer credits after you have accepted our Offer of Admission and we have received your final transcript. If your previous education was at a college you must order your final transcript showing your diploma has been awarded. If you are transferring from another university you will need to forward a final transcript showing all courses are completed.

### When do I register for my courses?

In June, once you have accepted our Offer of Admission, we will email you detailed information regarding registration.

### What about financial assistance?

Information about scholarships, awards and bursaries can be found on our Financial Aid website at nipissingu.ca/bursaries. If you are an Ontario resident and need help paying for your education, the Ontario Student Assistance Program (OSAP) may be able to help. Go to ontario.ca/osap to see how much you could get and to apply.

#### What about residence?

All undergraduate students, in any year of study, attending the North Bay campus, are eligible to apply for residence. Spaces are offered based on availability and the date of submission of the application and deposit. More information can be found within this package, or by visiting www.nipissingu.ca/residence. Degree Program	Required 4U or equivalent courses
Bachelor of Arts (BA) Bachelor of Fine Arts (BFA) Bachelor of Commerce (BComm)	Computer Science or Mathematics — requires Calculus & Vectors and one other Mathematics
Bachelor of Arts (BA) — Criminal Justice	Applicants graduating from Community and Justice Services, Police Foundations or Law Clerk diplomas and entering Corrections and Community Justice Services, Policing, or Legal Studies and Administration respectively must graduate from their college diploma with a minimum overall average of 75%.
Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA)	Two Mathematics are recommended. Student admitted without two 4U maths or equivalent will be required to complete MATH 1911 and/or MATH 1912 in their first year. Your offer of admission will indicate if you are required to complete one or both courses.
Bachelor of Physical and Health Education (BPHE)	Biology or Introduction to Kinesiology; also must be eligible as a full-time full course load student.
Bachelor of Science (BSc)	Biology — requires Biology; Chemistry; one of Calculus & Vectors or Advanced Functions  Computer Science — requires Calculus & Vectors; one other Mathematics; one of Biology, Chemistry or Physics  Data Science — also requires Calculus & Vectors; Advanced Functions; one of Biology, Chemistry or Physics  Environmental Biology and Technology — requires Biology; Chemistry; one of Calculus & Vectors or Advanced Functions or Physics  Environment and Physical Geography — requires Mathematics; one of Chemistry or Physics  Mathematics — requires Calculus & Vectors; Advanced Functions; one of Biology, Chemistry or Physics  Psychology — requires one Mathematics; one of Chemistry or Physics
Bachelor of Arts (BA) or Bachelor of Science (BSc) combined with Bachelor of Commerce (BComm)	Regular requirements for the degree program and major as indicated above
Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BScN)	Biology and Chemistry; also must be eligible as a full-time full course load student.
Bachelor of Social Work (BSW) (Year 1 & 2 only)	English (ENG4U minimum grade 70%) or equivalent; year one and two admissions only.
Honours Undergraduate Degree*/ Concurrent Bachelor of Education P/J, J/I and I/S	English (ENG4U minimum grade 70%) or equivalent, one 3U, 3M, or 4U Mathematics (minimum grade 60%) or equivalent, plus the admission requirements for the undergraduate degree program.  *Available with all four year honours degree programs except Nursing and Social Work.
